Geography

Task 1 – Discuss the word natural and what this might mean. Ask your child what they think natural means. Encourage them to use this word as they look through the pictures on the power point. As they look at each picture they should say natural or not natural and explain how they know.

Task 2 – Children will now need to understand the term physical geography. It is important they know that this means the Earth's natural features, e.g. mountains, oceans, deserts etc. Children will then look at the pictures and circle those which show physical geography and how they know. Encourage children to say physical geography as they circle the correct pictures

Task 3 – Look at the three different physical features in India. Choose one and draw. Write sentences about your picture.

Discuss with your child `what makes you` happy, sad, worried or angry? You can use the feelings wheel (task 1) to help. They can then think about three things that makes them happy and make a poster (task 2).
