Why is it Important?

1 in 7 children will at some point live with domestic abuse. Its not uncommon and isn't something they should be ashamed of.

The effects can be long lasting, and children can be reluctant to talk about it, especially if they think it might upset people. It may not be obvious they are struggling.

Our support gives them a safe space to talk if they want to, and to sort out the thoughts and feelings they may be having. This helps them move forward in a healthy way.

We Question children Don't about the past

Some parents worry we may ask children lots of upsetting questions about things that have gone on in the past. Our support is child led, so we talk about what the child wants to, and are led by their wishes.

We Talk about inappropriate things

We tackle all issues in an age appropriate way. For example, in healthy relationship work in primary school, we talk about safe and unsafe secrets with friends at school as a way of having the conversation about boundaries.

We About your child's wellbeing

Some parents worry that if they allow us to support their child Children's Services will get involved. In reality, the more support a child has, the less likely they will be concerned.
