Learning Project Week beginning 11.5.20

Year Group: Year 6

Reading:

- Children to read to parents daily. This can be a variety of things e.g. fiction, non-fiction, magazines, online articles,
- Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they
 have borrowed from the library. Can they note down unfamiliar words and find out the
 meanings of these? Are they able to use in sentences?

Maths:

Daily tasks

- Play times table rock stars and try to beat your best times on all timetables.
- Daily arithmetic for different areas of maths. Your child should aim to work on timing yourself to solve 30 arithmetic questions in 40 minutes.

Handwriting:

 Ask your child to write a letter to their best friend. They will need to talk about themselves (what they are doing, how they are feeling ...) and then ask questions for their friends to respond to. These letters could be posted on twitter so that they can respond to each other.

Weekly Maths Tasks

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- Working on Times Table Rockstars. The same login as usual.
- Get a piece of paper and ask your child to show everything you know about fractions, decimals and percentages. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. They can be as creative as they want to be. Please upload examples to @UplandsManor Twitter page.
- Have your children revise fractions, decimals and percentages using their mathletics login.
- At the end of the week please complete the fractions, decimals ad percentages worksheet. (questions and answers attached).
- There will be lots of activities linked to your maths learning this week on skills ladder

Weekly Reading and Writing Tasks

- Ask your child to pick their favourite books and create their own blurb to summarise what the story is about without revealing too many spoilers. There are some covers attached from books that we have been reading together in school if there cannot think of their own.
- If they are feeling creative they can create their own book cover from scratch.

- Have your children watch you as you complete a task, can they follow you? This could be anything like, making a meal, cleaning the kitchen, washing clothes, planting flowers....
- Have your child make notes and then create their own set of instructions. They can use the features sheet to help them remember what they need to include. You could test how good their instructions are by asking them to do the task themselves with only their instructions to help them.
- Complete a previous reading paper try and time yourself 1 hour 'Nanning Rolling/X-Ray/Boy on his bike' (texts, questions and answers attached)

Learning Project to be dome throughout the week

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to reflect on their life and how it has been impacted by the lockdown. The rest is just for FUN and to take their minds off what would have been SATs week.

- Carpool Karaoke Get your children to think of their favourite songs from throughout their childhood. Can they think of one per year of their school life? Once they have selected these songs they will need to: create a costume, learn the lyrics to lip-sync and even create a dance routine. The children can then set up a camera in a car to record themselves performing one or all of their favourite songs (you could even dress up as James Corden and help introduce the tracks for them). - Lockdown lifeline Get you children to create a time capsule full of things that they would leave to someone that may have to go through a lockdown themselves. This could be written advice, objects that helped them get through it or even their own creations of what they wish they had themselves to help them get through the lockdown blues.
- Appy days- Ask your children to create their very own App which is related to the current pandemic. This could be an App for anything. It could: help them keep in touch with their friends, keep them educated, keep them from becoming insane with boredom. It could even be an App aimed at helping to stop the spread of the virus to help those who are elderly or vulnerable. They will need to create a logo, explain how it works and obtain and record feedback from the rest of their family.
- Is football coming home- Euro 2020 might have been postponed but that won't stop us thinking about it. I would like the children to create their own Euro 2020 display board including: A new logo, a history of the tournament and predictions for the tournament (winners, runners-up, top scorers, tam of the tournament etc.). I then want them to choose their favourite team and draw their current football top and then design their very own.
