Year Group: Year 6

Reading:

- Children to read to parents daily. This can be a variety of things e.g. fiction, non-fiction, magazines, online articles.
- Ask your child to read a chapter from their home reading book or a book that they have borrowed from the library. Ask them to create questions based on the chapter that they have read which could be used to test a partner's knowledge. Please upload examples to @UplandsManor Twitter page.
- Read The Peculiar Peggs of Riddling Woods and try answering the questions based on the text.

Daily tasks

Maths:

- Play on TT Rockstars Encourage them to challenge a classmate to a Rock Slam. Can they get a higher score than their friend?
- Work through activities on Skills Ladder.
- Daily arithmetic for different areas of maths. Your child should aim to work on timing yourself to solve 30 arithmetic questions in 40 minutes.

Handwriting:

Ask your child to write a letter an adult or child that they will miss when they leave
Uplands Manor. Encourage them to reflect on why they will miss that person, think about
memorable moments and ask them to focus on joined, cursive handwriting.

Lunar Theme Park Project

- Look at the Powerpoint of the Lunar Theme Park Project.
 'The year is 2050. Man is now colonising the moon and Lord Alan Sugar has decided to build the first lunar theme park in history! He wants to commission (pay for) someone to plan. Develop and run the theme park of his dreams...'
- Work through the booklet to complete the different tasks:
 - <u>Task 1</u> Create a name and logo for your theme park and jot down ideas. Spend some time thinking about theme parks that you visited. Think about the different types of rides and attractions. Look at Youtube videos of rides for Alton Towers, Drayton Manor, Disney World etc.
 - Task 2 You have a budget of £500,000 to create a theme park. Draw the design on the squared paper (be sure to consider colours too). Use the table to work out how much each ride or feature will cost and how many squares each item takes up. Be sure to keep track of your money as you go. Remember you must have the compulsory items.
 - <u>Task 3</u> Work out how much it will cost to run your theme park each day using the table of Ongoing Costs. Remember the table shows much it costs to run each item be sure to multiply by how many you have
 - <u>Task 4</u> Decide on the entrance fee for your park use this to work out how much money you will
 make in the first month that your park is open.

- <u>Task 5</u> Design a variety of advertisements for your park (Radio, Poster, Leaflet and TV). Use
 persuasive language and interesting vocabulary to make your advertisements appealing to the reader.
