



## Learning Project Week beginning 08.06.20

Year Group: Year 6

### Daily tasks

#### Reading:

*Monday-* During your child's daily reading, play some classical music, rock music, jazz music and pop music. Ask your child to draw an emoji to represent how each music genre made them feel whilst they were reading.

*Tuesday-* Ask your child to find the lyrics to their favourite song and to create some new verses. Can they perform and read the new verses to the family?

*Wednesday-* Challenge your child to read a text and pick out unfamiliar vocabulary and find these out for themselves

*Thursday-* Can you find a poem that you like and enjoy? Read a selection online. Can you write your own version with a similar theme?

*Friday-* Visit Audible and let your child choose a book to listen to. Ask them to write a review when they have finished and share it with a friend (remotely).

#### Maths:

*Monday-* Work with your child to find the missing angle in the triangles or around a point.

*Tuesday-* Ask your child to draw a map from their bedroom to the kitchen. Calculate the total degrees of turn involved on the journey. They can repeat this activity for other areas in your home or for their daily walk.

*Wednesday-* Encourage your child to look for and collect 3D objects around the home. For the ones they have selected, get them to name the 3D shape, list the properties (the number of edges, faces and vertices) and draw the net to match.

*Thursday-* Get your child to practise measuring and reading angles with a protractor with this online game.

*Friday-* Create a poster of all things learnt about angles this week

#### Handwriting:

Ask your child to write a short story for a younger child – think about themes they would like and the vocabulary that you use. Focus on your presentation in your final version

### Weekly Maths Tasks

#### Maths

- Working on Times Table Rockstars. The same login.as usual
- Get a piece of paper and ask your child to show everything you know about angles – different angles and names. This could be pictures, diagrams, explanations, methods etc. They can be as creative as they want to be. Please upload examples to @UplandsManor Twitter page
- Play on Hit the Button - focus on times tables, division facts and squared numbers
- Get your child to work on their reasoning and problem solving by practising past SATs questions that are broken down into topic areas and have videos linked to them that can be watched if needed.
- Focus on angles, missing angles and angles around a point

<p>The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to complete their own research and find out about different key dates that are happening this week.</p> <p><u><b>Carnival Time</b></u> The Rio carnival is a spectacle of samba, costumes and dance and takes place every year. Here are some of the pictures from this year's parade. Challenge your child to research the samba inspired costumes and headdresses worn during the parades. Ask them to design, label and make their own mask or headdress taking inspiration from the research completed.</p> <p><u><b>National Best Friends Day 8<sup>th</sup> June</b></u> This is the time to celebrate the friendships that are so important to us, can you produce a piece of work demonstrating the importance of friendship and what friendship means to you? You can present this in art or music or even write a poem- please share examples on Twitter.</p> <p><u><b>Science – Inheritance</b></u> What do we mean by the term inheritance? What does variation mean? What causes variation? Discuss with your family what have you inherited from your family? Use the inheritance cards to help you with the discussion</p> <p><u><b>Refugee Week June 2020</b></u> What is a refugee? Read Hamam's story in detail and look at the kinds of tough decisions real child refugees have to make If you were a refugee, what would you take? Complete the activities linked to this topic</p> <p><u><b>Climate Change</b></u> What do we mean by climate change? Where does this take place? Who is effected by this? Complete the activity linked to Climate Change.</p> <p><u><b>Transition activities</b></u> It is coming up to the time that Secondary School starts, which can be a little overwhelming for some. On the Home Learning page there are a series of activities to encourage conversation about the changes ahead and how you feel?
