

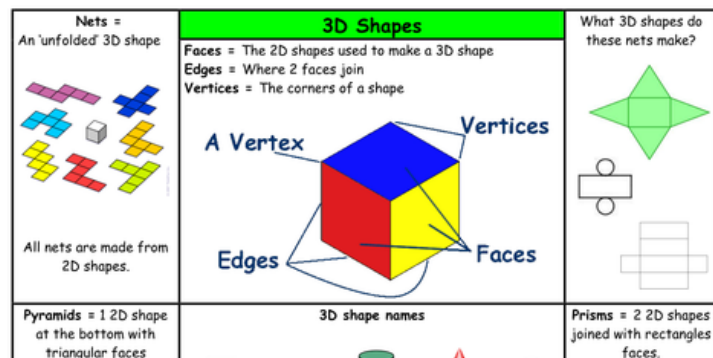
Reading
