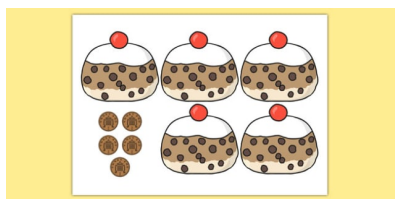
Number Activities:
