Daily Phonics	Phonics: Speed sounds set 1 Revise the pictures for sounds: m, a, s, d, t, l, n, p, g, o, c, k, u, b, f, e. l, h, r Help your child to recognise each picture for each sound. Please see attached sheet. Then learn the grapheme (letter sound) for the following: m,a,s,t,d,i,n,p,g,o,c.k,u,b,f Oral blending Collect some objects from around the house e.g. cup, mug, lid, fork, chair, pen, book, lamp, spoon.		
tasks	Split each word up and say the sounds e.g. c-u-p then say cup. M-u-g then say mug. S-p-oo-n then say spoon. Challenge: You point to an object and your child practices splitting the sounds of the word e.g. you point to cup, your child says the sounds c-u-p cup. Initial sounds		
Play 'I spy' in your house. Say "I spy something beginning with b". Can your child guess it's a(book). Repeat with other initial sounds. 't' = tv 'p' = plate 'c' = car 'a' = apple

•	Can your child go to the toilet and wash their hands independently.	
•	Can your child use connectives whilst talking e.g. I would like some toast because I am hungry.	
•	I like eating strawberries and I like chocolate.	
•	Can your child explain what's happening to their bodies when they exercise e.g. feeling hot and sweaty, tired, heart beating faster.	
•	Does your child understand and answer 'how' and 'why' questions. E.g. Why do you brush your teeth? How do you brush your teeth? How do plants grow?	
•	Can your child hold a pencil between thumb and two fingers with good control and start to form lowercase letters such as in their name?	
•	Can your child retell a simple familiar story?	
•	Can your child tell you about what they did at school? E.g "I went to school and I played with the toys. Then I sang Humpty Dumpty and ate some toast and drank milk. After that I played outside on the slide and the bikes. It was so much fun."	
•	Can your child count to 10 forwards and backwards?	
•	Can your child recognise numbers 0,1,2,3,4,5	
•	Can your child touch count objects to 5 and tell you how many there are?	

Speed Sound Pictures Set 1

Sounds m, s, n, f, l, r, v and z are all <u>stretched</u> sounds, e.g. 'mmmmm' and 'sssssss'. All other sounds are <u>bouncy</u> sounds, e.g. 'a-a-a' and 'd-d-d'.
