## Weekly Maths tasks



Have a go at the following activities...


- Estimating angles (protractor needed)

Weekly Reading and Writing tasks


This week's focus in reading will be all about finding the meaning of new words.




How many 3D shapes can you name?

This week's focus in writing will be about the picture called waking the giant.



Story starter...


The ground began to shake. Birds sprang from the branches of trees in a state of panic as the huge figure crawled out of the earth.

First it was an elbow...Then a head...Then a colossal, moss-covered, stone face ...

An almighty bellow erupted from the giant's enormous mouth, shaking the windows of the house. He dragged his immense torso out of the ground, then his feet (which were the size of doubledecker buses) and stood up to his full height.

Menacingly, he turned and strolled towards the house, a look of hunger in his bulging eyes...

Question time... What has awoken the giant? Do you think he poses a danger to people? What was he doing under the ground? How long do you think he had been there for? How will people react to his presence? What would you do if you saw a giant? Can you include some speech in your writing, using inverted commas? E.g. "Stand back! Get out of his way!" Emily bellowed at her mother. Can you draw a picture of the giant once he is fully out of the ground? Perhaps you could draw him next to some ordinary objects to show how huge he really is!



- How will you construct the framework for your model theatre?
- What materials and cutting and joining techniques will you use to add the detail?
- How will you move and control the figures on the stage?
- How can you incorporate lights and how will they be controlled?
- Can you add any other electrical controlled features such as opening and closing curtains?
- Can you incorporate any other moving features using mechanisms?
- Can you perform a show using your theatre?
- Can you produce a step-by-step guide to make your working model theatre?



Using the picture shown above as an example, think about a particular story that you are familiar with and create your very own modelled theatre to produce this as a book to a wider audience. Think about some of the questions above during the planning process of your model.
