## We will be focusing on six trees:

- · Ash tree
- · Birch tree
- Horse chestnut tree
- Oak tree
- Maple tree
- · Elm tree



The leaves of an ash tree are oval.
They have about 7 leaflets on each stem


An ash tree is a deciduous tree.
This means that it's leaves fall off in autumn.



The leaves of a birch tree are round with a pointy tip.


A birch tree is a deciduous tree.

What does deciduous mean?



The leaves of a horse chestnut tree is are spiky. They have about 5 leaflets on each stem

This is a deciduous tree.
It is also known as a conker tree!




The leaves of an oak tree is are long with rounded edges.

They are mostly deciduous.

They produce acorns!





The leaves of a maple tree are quite pointy and spiky. It has sharp points.

This tree is a deciduous tree.


The leaves of an elm tree are quite feathery and has one point.

This tree is a deciduous tree.


