City

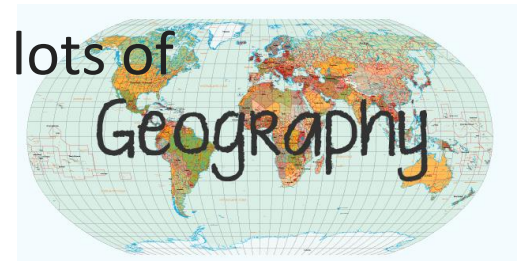
A settlement with a small number of houses, usually in a country.

Town

The largest type of settlement, containing lots of important buildings and lots of people.

Village

Larger than a **village**, this settlement has lots of houses and schools.

City

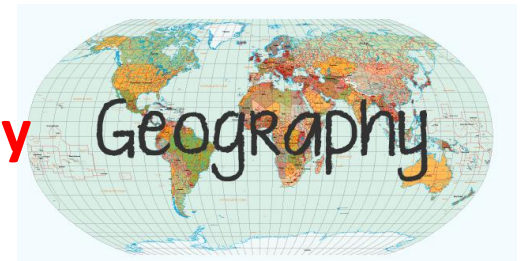
The largest type of settlement, containing lots of important buildings and lots of people. e.g. **Birmingham or Liverpool**

Town

Larger than a **village**, this settlement has lots of houses and schools. e.g. **Smethwick or West Bromwich**

Village

A settlement with a small number of houses, usually in a country area. e.g. **Kinver or Hagley**

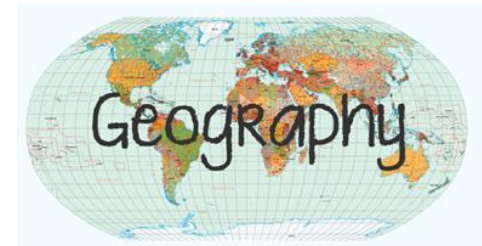
