We will also be teaching some elements of sex education (where do babies come from), using age and developmentally appropriate resources. The lessons that will be taught are:

- Year 4 - Having a baby
- Year 5 – Conception and the creation of new life
- Year 6 - Conception to birth

Parents and carers have the right to view materials before they are used and also to request that their child is excused from any sex education lessons once they have viewed the materials and have made an informed decision.
