Transition

- We understand that moving from primary to secondary school is a huge event in yours and your child's life
- We want to make the transition as smooth as possible even more so this year

Uniform

- Black blazer with school badge. Blazer to be worn at all times.
- Plain white blouse or shirt, suitable for wear with a tie. These should be tucked in.
- School tie.
- Black trousers/black skirt plain and not tight fitting.
- Black shoes not trainers. Max heel size 4cm.
- Optional mid grey V neck jumper.
- Coats removed as students enter the Classroom



PE Uniform

- Black and blue hoody or zip tracksuit top with school logo.
- Black and blue polo shirt with logo.
- Black and blue rugby shirt with logo.
- Black shorts/tracksuit bottoms with school logo.
- Black football socks.
- Football boots & Trainers.
- Shin pads and gum shield appropriate for sport played.
