Q3 School Response:

Safety and safeguarding are our top priority at school. It is again extremely positive feedback that all but one parent surveyed say that their children feel safe at school.

Qs 4, 5 and 6 School Response:

As was recognised by Ofsted in the summer, we have a strong curriculum offer at school and a consistently good standard of teaching. As a result, children do make good progress across school and achieve well. However, there will of course be times when individual children will require further support or intervention to help them to either keep up or catch up with learning.

This year, we have ensured that we have teaching assistants and tutors working across the school to provide interventions and provide extra support to children with their learning. If you are ever concerned about your child's progress in school, please arrange to speak with their class teacher who can talk you through ways to support them at home as well as ways we can provide any further support in school.

Q7 School Response:


Behaviour in classrooms and around school is good, and children are aware of our rules, rewards and sanctions. Visitors often comment on how polite and well behaved our children are, and we are very proud of them for this. In the summer, Ofsted were also very positive about behaviour and attitudes in school.

In a large and inclusive school, there are of course some children who struggle with regulating their emotions and behaviours, and as a result have bespoke support and strategies to support them. These are usually linked to diagnosed additional needs. However, over the past few years, even though we have seen an increase in the number of children identified as having additional social, emotional and mental health needs, we have seen a significant reduction in the number of isolated 'serious' behaviour incidents and subsequent removals from classrooms (internal exclusions) and suspensions.



Q8.

This school deals effectively with bullying.



Q8 School Response:

As a school, we recognise that bullying can and does happen. What is important is how incidents are responded to.

It is often necessary for us to communicate 'what' bullying is, as opposed to an isolated incident of a child being unkind. Our slogan is 'STOP', which stands for several times on purpose. We will of course deal with all incidents in line with our behaviour policy, but they do not always constitute bullying.

When bullying does occur, we ensure that all parents of children in involved are aware of what is happening, sanctions are put in place for children, measures are agreed to prevent the chance of things recurring, and we work with the children to educate them about the impact of their actions.

It is important that we know about bullying concerns and can address them as early as possible, and so if you do have any concerns, please speak with your child's teacher to raise them. Equally, if you feel that any bullying has occurred and you are not happy with the outcome, please speak to a member of my senior team so that we are aware and hopefully address things for you.

Q10 School Response:

We try really hard as a school to get things right for you and your children, however there will be times when you would like to speak with someone at school about a concern that you may have. Responses to feedback given in general comments:

- Free toast in the mornings we have tried offering toast in the morning to children. Unfortunately, due to the size of our school and the number of children, this is logistically very challenging. It also requires a lot of staff time against the backdrop of falling school budgets. We do however offer access to a breakfast club to families that need it, and our pastoral team have fruit and snacks available for identified children throughout the day if they need them.
- Day off to celebrate Diwali as a school we understand and support the right of families to celebrate significant religious festivals. Sometimes, depending on when they fall, it might be appropriate for parents to request a day off school for religious observance. At other times, it might not. If this is something that you feel your child needs to observe and it falls at a time when it must be celebrated during the school day, please submit a leave of absence request for religious observance so that this can be considered.
- More online work and homework earlier this term, I shared our home learning policy with parents. This was an agreed strategy and approach having looked at research about the benefit of homework, as well as the challenges and negativity faced by some parents trying to get their children to do homework. We decided to focus on basic skills which are sent home every term and not set written homework each week for the children. This is always an impossible area to please all parents with, as some parents will equally feel that no homework should be being set at all. For those wanting more work, this is of course something that parents can choose to do with their children in addition to any home learning set.
- Well behaved children get overlooked I can assure parents and carers that this is not the case. We have lots of rewards in school for children who make the right choices and are well behaved: dojo points, certificates, Good to be Green awards etc. This week we are having our Good to be Green reward sessions for all children who have had good behaviour this term. Next term, we are also introducing a new 'House' system which will provide further opportunities for all children. If there are any specific concerns, I am always happy to speak with parents about these.
