



Key Instant Recall Facts

Year 1 – Autumn 1

Recognise numerals to 20 and say 1 more than a given number to 20.

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for them to recall these facts **instantly**.

0 – 20.

They should be able to recognise all numerals (written numbers) within 20.

They should also be able to say 1 more than any given number within 20. For example:

1 more than 11 is 12. 1 more than 19 is 20.

Top Tips

The secret to success is practising **little** and **often**. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey? You don't need to practise them all at once: perhaps you could have a fact of the day. If you would like more ideas, please speak to your child's teacher.

Use practical resources – Your child has some sweets, can they count how many? Can they carry on counting to 20? As they eat their sweets, can they count backwards? Look out for any numbers written in our environment (TV remote, mobile phone, house door numbers, bus numbers, price labels in shops etc) and ask your child to tell you what the number says.
