This week we will be working towards writing a character description.

Below is an example of a character description. We'd like you to draw the character that is being describe and <u>underline</u> the words that you used from the description to help you draw the picture.

#### Task 2

Yesterday, you drew a picture of Bunce from 'Fantastic Mr Fox'. You were asked to underline the words that helped you draw the picture. These words are called adjectives.

An adjective describes a noun (person, place of thing). An adjective can describe how a noun looks, smells, tastes, sounds or feels. We call these senses. When describing a person, you can also use adjectives to describe their personality. Some of these adjectives, like the ones that describe smell, you would not have been able to draw yesterday, because you can't see them.

Below is a list of adjectives. Sort them into the correct sense that they could describe. Some of them may be used to describe more than one sense.

### <u>Task 5</u>

In this task, you will use your plan and the picture of Boggis to help you write your character description. Remember, as an author, when you are writing a character description, you need the reader to be able to imagine exactly what that character is like. **You need to paint a picture in their mind with your words!** 

Remember to use:

- Adjectives to describe different senses.
- A range of sentence openers (don't start every sentence with Boggis or he)
- Words like 'because, that, if, when, but, and, or' to extend sentences.
- Use capital letter and full stops to punctuate your sentences.
