Here is an example

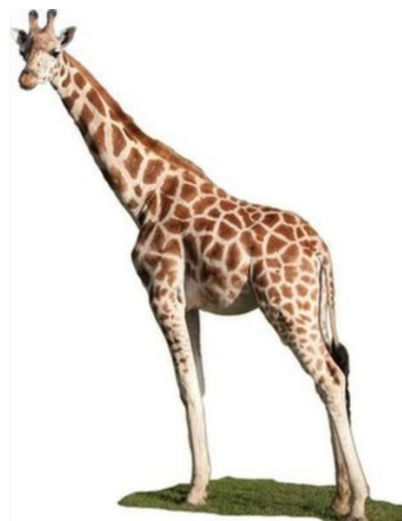


||||||| A lion is a mammal. He has got a bushy mane and a long tail. He has
