The Apostrophe for Possession



Instead of writing:

We can write:

It was cold in Faiza's house.



When we use the **possessive apostrophe** for something belonging to one person or thing:

1. We write the name

Caleb

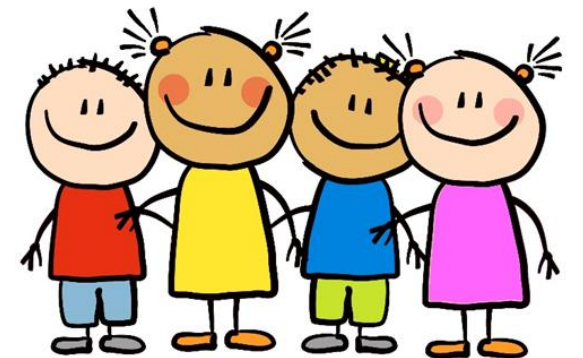
2. We add the apostrophe

3. We add 's'

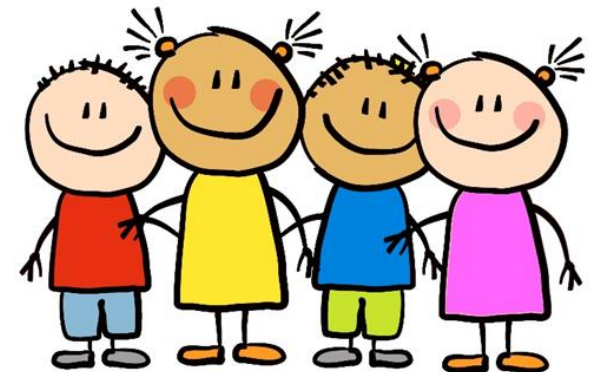

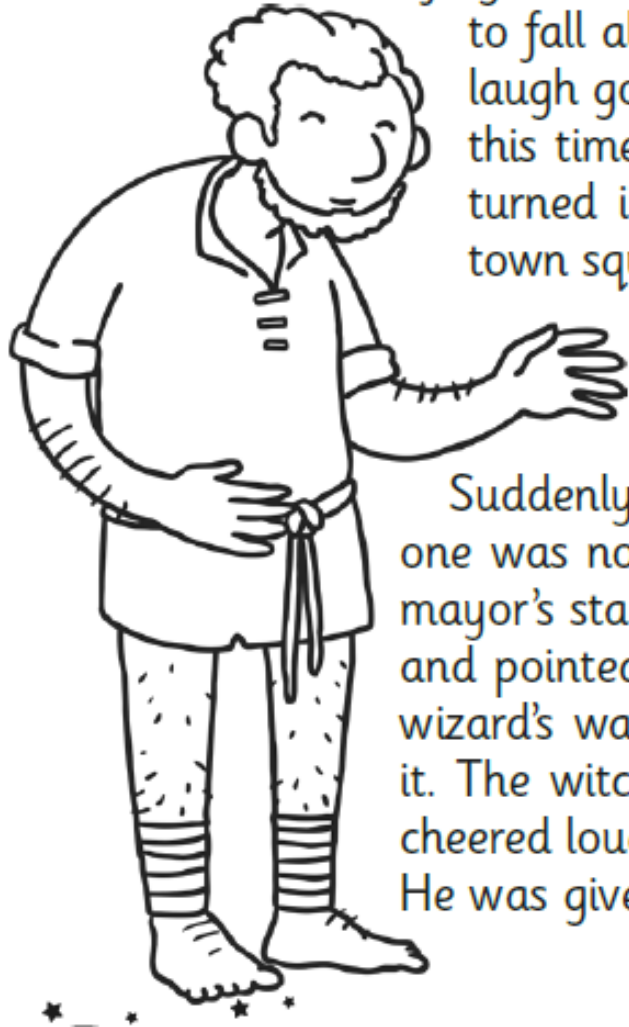
"Good afternoon giants of Giant's Village. Welcome to the Great Celebration Carnival."
