# The Apostrophe for Possession





Instead of writing: It was cold in the house belonging to Faiza.

We can write: It was cold in Faiza's house.



When we use the **possessive apostrophe** for something belonging to one person or thing:

	Caleb's scarf
<b>3.</b> We add 's'	Caleb' <b>s</b>
<b>2.</b> We add the apostrophe	Caleb'
<b>1.</b> We write the name	Caleb
