Weekly Maths Tasks	Weekly Reading Tasks
We have decided to focus on subtraction this week with a bit of times tables. Tasks 1, 2 and 3 (Maths week 2 PowerPoint) naturally progress and should be completed in order. The other tasks can be completed as you wish! <u>Task 1</u> Complete task 1 on the 'maths week 2' PowerPoint. This requires you to subtract a 1-digit number by counting backwards on a numberline. <u>Task 2</u> Complete task 2 on the 'maths week 2' PowerPoint. This task requires you to use your knowledge of tens and ones to subtract 2-digit numbers. <u>Task 3</u> Complete task 3 on the 'maths week 2' PowerPoint. This task moves onto 'bridging' and will require you to follow the example on the PowerPoint! <u>Task 4</u> Spend 30 minutes on Numbots. It would be really useful if you focused on subtraction. <u>Task 5</u> Spend 30 minutes practising your times tables skills on TTRockstars. Focus on your x10 tables.	To support the reading journey, it would be helpful if the following tasks were completed in order and where possible in your red home schooling books. You will find a Powerpoint to help you complete your learning in the English section of the main page! <u>Task 1</u> Using last week's book of the week, 'A Squash and a Squeeze, can you find pairs of rhyming words? <u>Task 2</u> Can you infer what the old lady means by a 'curious' plan? <u>Task 3</u> - Read the non-fiction text 'Extreme Weather' with an adult, the link to the text is in on the PowerPoint. <u>Task 4</u> Can you use or create a fact finder and write 4 things you learnt from 'Extreme Weather'. <u>Task 5</u> Spend some time looking at the a-e sound and complete the phonics activity that suits your ability best. Activities range from 1-3 with a challenge at the end!

We'd like you to talk about the different plants that you have found (can you name or research any names).
